






DID YOU KNOW?

THINGS I KNOW ABOUT MALDON... THINGS I KNOW ABOUT TIPTREE...

the relationship between the two.

Did you know that Maldon is home to the very first TESCO self-service supermarket in the UK, which was opened in 1956? It is also home to The Maldon Crystal Salt Company, which opened for business in 1882 and is still going today, salt being a major industry in the town.



And did you know, Tiptree was first attested circa 1225 (before the football team was born) and was originally named Typpetre meaning Tippa's Tree? Tiptree is home to one of the world's most famous Jam Factories (or as posh people call it, 'preserves') in Wilkin & Sons, the company being founded in 1885 by local farming family, the Wilkins. Now not many people know this ... in the first half of the 20th century, the 'village' was served by the Kelvedon and Tollesbury Light Railway, which was colloquially known as the Crab & Winkle line. See, I bet you are all glad you read this page, aren't you?!!

Football wise, I'm sure you will find a comprehensive history of the two clubs elsewhere in this issue - suffice to say I was there when Tiptree United played in the Carlsberg FA Vase final in 2002 at Villa Park. Sadly, they lost that game 1-0 after extra time to Whitley Bay, but none the less a fantastic achievement for what was basically a village club from the depths of Essex.







THE VISITORS

The re-establishment of normal life after the war saw the formation of Maldon Town FC in 1946, with their HQ at the Rose and Crown in the High Street and home venue was at Sadd's Ground on the causeway.

The Mid-Essex League Div 2 gave them their first league trophy in that season, when they gained the runners-up spot. Now transferring their home ground to the Promenade Park and joining the North-Essex League, they once again achieved runners-up spot in this league and were also runners-up in the Essex Junior Cup. Returning to the Mid-Essex Premier Division saw them lift the league title in consecutive seasons, as well as the league cup in 1949/50 Season. Success now followed them to their newly acquired Wallace Binder ground in Fambridge Road, joining the Essex and Suffolk Border League, that season the runners up spot was gained but the major trophy that year was lifting the Essex Intermediate Cup, beating a strong Leytonstone Reserve team 2-1.



Ex-Liverpool hero Kevin Baron took over the management reins continuing the success when his teams gained the runners up position in the Essex Intermediate Cup in 1964/65, 1965/66. The league winning team of 1965/66 gained them senior status, and they joined the Eastern Counties League in 1966. After six years in this league they joined the Essex Senior League, picking up the league title in 1984/85 and almost completing the double when beaten in the final of the league cup by Chelmsford City Reserves. Moving to the new ground in Park Drive in 1994, and crossing the pyramid structure to return to the Eastern Counties League in 1996 under the continued management of Ben Embery and his assistant Steve Jackson, the pair were very unfortunate not to obtain promotion in their first season in the Jewson League (ECL). Our second year in the League proved to be a different story, with the team gaining promotion to the Premier Division, ending the 1997/98 season in the runners-up position.

In our first year in the Premier League we finished a creditable 13th position and improved that to eighth in the second year. We now entered a new era with a new manager Colin Wallington, in our third year in the Premier League we finished fourth and now looked good to progress further. In season 2002/03 we reached the semi final of the FA Vase losing to local rivals AFC Sudbury.

After 14 years as chairman Bob Large decided to stand down as he felt he had taken the Club as far has he could. The new chairman Mike Kirkham stated that he hoped to take the Club to the next step up the ladder in a few years. Season 2005/06 after two promotion seasons we found ourselves in the Ryman Premier. This found us fighting relegation for the whole season, with our fate still being in our own hands right up to the last 3 games of the season. We did reach the final of the Thames Side Trophy losing 3-1 to Canvey Island and also the final of the Eastern Floodlit Competition losing on penalties 5-3 to Billericay Town.

Season 2006/07 saw us play in the Ryman North Division, where we finished fourth, and due to the Club not applying for promotion, the club were excluded from the play offs.

THE VISITORS

The 2007/08 season started with a new Manager Russell Tanner, after Colin Wallington left the club to join Tiptree Utd Russell brought in Dean Parrott as his assistant. The club made several major signings during the close season but these players moved on when Clubs from a higher level came in for them, this left Russell and Dean to bring in some fresh faces from Russell Tanner's former Club Witham Town plus some of the talented youngsters on the books who went on to win the Clubs Best Young Player Award that season, although the club never got to the play offs It was felt that the team had a good season.

In September 2008 former Tottenham and Millwall player Stuart Nethercott was promoted from his position of Assistant Manager to Caretaker Manager (and ultimately to permanent Manager) following the departure of Russell Tanner. Stuart's reign lasted a year, as he was replaced by former Manager Colin Wallington who hoped to bring back some of the good times to Maldon Town. Season 2009/10 saw mixed for-tunes on the pitch, due in part to the large turnover of players during the period it took the new management to put together their own team. Away from the pitch new Chairman, Alan Brockhouse and his Committee entered into a ground share arrangement with local Club Tiptree United, which, as the season progressed, saw the relationship between the two Clubs grow stronger giving obvious signs that further, more formal, amalgamation of the two Clubs seemed on the cards.

In 2009 Ed Garty took over as chairman/Owner at Maldon Town as well as running Tiptree United. In 2010 Ed Garty merged both clubs and formed Maldon & Tiptree FC

Following the retirement of Manager, Colin Wallington, assistants, Brad King and Glen Knight were promoted to Joint Managers and put in charge of the Club for the season under the new name of Maldon & Tiptree Football Club.

Season 2010/2011 saw the new club placed in or around the play-off positions for the majority of the season. Despite another high turnover of players, the good standard of football was maintained and it was frustrating for the club to fall away in the later stages of the season when suspensions and injuries eventually took their toll to leave the club frustratingly short of the play-off positions at the end of April. Following King and Knight's departure during that season Mike Flanagan came in and took on the caretaker role and steered the club to a respectable mid-table position. At the start of the 2012-13 campaign, Ex- Stansted & Redbridge boss Terry Spillane was appointed as Manager. After a fantastic start to the season, the club found them-selves at the top of the table but an incredible run by eventual Champions Grays Athletic meant Maldon had to settle for a place in the play- offs. Disappointment came in the Final when they lost a two goal lead to draw with Thamesmead Town, who then won through on penalties. Kevin Horlock was the team manager from 2016 & 2017 seasons but unfortunately promotion did not come about through all his hard work. Wayne Brown has been appointed the manager for season 2018 - 2019 and hopes to have a better season and secure that Premier Division place with his very young side.

Seasiders Captain Dan Davis said after the game on Saturday, "If you want to look at scorelines, Saturday's 2-1 defeat (at home to Bury Town) was an improvement (and) Bury are one of the two best sides in the league." He was referring, of course, to coming unstuck away at Bury in The Velocity Trophy back in early September 5-1 and going down again a few weeks ago 4-1 in The Suffolk Premier Cup. Davis added, "The new coaches are trying to implement ideas and people are listening. There's more discipline. We're working on a new shape and for large parts of the game it worked. Now we have that shape, we need to build on it. Although we didn't threaten going forward, we are competing better."

With Jordan Matthews and Jamal Wiggins still not fully recovered, we set up with Miles Powell in midfield and new loanee George Clarke up front, albeit in a wide role.

The Blues brought with them plenty of support and it was the visiting fans who were the happiest in the early stages, which saw both Cemal Ramadan and Ollie Hughes go close within the first minute or two. On 10 minutes keeper Danny Crump pulled off a decent save when clearing his line from a Ramadan effort at very close range to keep the game goalless.

Not long afterwards, a Callum Bennett corner resulted in a Miles Powell header straight at Bury keeper Daniel Barden. Meanwhile, at the other end, the early stages saw any number of free kicks and corners going Bury's way, resulting from consistent pressure, and it was almost inevitable that the deadlock would soon be broken. A Ross Crane free kick from the right, just outside the box, resulted in a Jake Chambers effort saved at close range, only for Gardner to pounce on the loose ball to give the visitors a deserved lead on 23 minutes.

Our first serious effort in front of goal followed another Callum Bennett corner on the right which allowed Armani Schaar to test Dan Barden in goal but, alas, to no avail. We had another chance when a training ground free kick on 35 minutes, taken by Callum Bennett, allowed Milo to float a good ball through to Josh Kerridge whose effort sailed across the face of the goal and just a little wide.

Bury had another couple of chances just before the break with Ramadan and Ryan Jolland both coming close.

In the second half, Nick Ingram was replaced by Jacob Lay shortly after the interval and Adam Hanson came on for George Clarke, who went down with a groin injury in his first game for the club.

Unfortunately, the second half was offering no real relief for the Seasiders with Oppong and Jolland both coming close for The Blues before Ollie Hughes managed to somehow head over Crump to give Bury a 2-0 lead.

With ten minutes to go until the end of proceedings, substitute Adam Hanson shot wide, providing just one of very few chances that fell our way. We did manage to pull one goal back deep into injury time when Milo was brought down in the box allowing Armani Schaar to step up for the resulting penalty. Daniel Barden did manage to save but Armani was first to the rebound to bring the score to 2-1. Under the new rules of the game this is now judged to be a goal from open play.

After the game we spoke to Assistant Manager Andy Crump who said, "Bury are a great side and against good sides you can't afford to give away the amount of free kicks and corners that we did. There were probably over ten set pieces we had to defend."

Last Sunday's front page of *The Non-League Paper* was going to be about the first round proper of the FA Cup.

About the excitement of the upcoming draw at Maldon & Tiptree as Non-League clubs eagerly awaited those life-changing ties to come out of the hat – and what a draw it turned out to be.

It was going to be about those clubs daring to dream. Isthmian Premier club Carshalton Athletic after they upset National League side Dagenham & Redbridge. Or Nantwich Town, who beat National League North high-fliers King's Lynn Town. Then there was the story of Kingstonian beating higher league opposition in Dartford.

There was also the drama at Potters Bar Town, who scored an equaliser against neighbours Barnet in the 11th minute of stoppage time to set up a replay. And there was the excitement of goalkeeper Alan Julian heading an injury-time equaliser at Sutton United to keep Billericay Town's FA Cup dream alive.

The front page was supposed to carry pictures capturing all the emotion of this great competition on another action-packed day in Non-League football.

Instead, for the second time in a month, it carried a story about allegations of racism. Once again, the ugly side of society has reared its head in Non-League, and English, football.

On the back of the shameful scenes in Bulgaria when England players were racially abused and the game was twice suspended, Haringey Borough walked off the pitch following alleged racism towards goalkeeper Valery Douglas Pajetat. Two men, aged 23 and 26, have since been arrested on suspicion of racially aggravated common assault.

The incident came in the 65th minute following a Yeovil penalty where he claims he was spat at and verbally abused by fans. The match didn't restart and was abandoned. Boss Tom Loizou also said defender Coby Rowe was targeted.

English football was appalled when the men's senior team was on the end of horrific abuse and there have been calls for strong action against Bulgaria and their authorities. We are equally appalled at these allegations.

FA chairman Greg Clarke spoke in the immediate aftermath of the Bulgaria game. He rightly pointed out that we must also look at the game in this country because there are issues that clearly need addressing.

There is no hiding from that fact. The conversation must include what we are doing about our game.

It's four weeks since allegations were made during the National League game between Hartlepool United and Dover Athletic.

Dover players Inih Effiong and Ricky Modeste were subjected to racist abuse and gestures. Pools players heard it and were upset at what they saw coming from some of their home fans. While they considered walking off the pitch, in the end the game was played to a conclusion.

Hartlepool were rightly praised for their response to the situation and it looks like Yeovil have reacted in a similar way. Boss Darren Sarll says they stand alongside Haringey and the club say they will be cooperating with the investigation which The FA say is ongoing. The tie is to be replayed on Tuesday, October 29.

If proven, the two supporters should never watch a game of football in this country again. Of course, 99.9 per cent of Yeovil fans will be ashamed of what has allegedly happened. Hopefully anyone who has seen or heard anything comes forward to ensure the investigation can be as thorough as is needed.

As we've said before, we all have a responsibility to drive this abhorrent behaviour out of our game and out of our society.

No footballer, no person, should be attacked just because of their skin colour.

In a high-profile competition, Haringey's actions will be seen far and wide. Hopefully this can be a stepping stone towards a better future. Their stand is to be applauded. In times gone past, the incident may not have come to light until after the game.

By stopping an FA Cup game in its tracks, the message will be louder. Racists are not welcome in our football grounds at any level. Only then can we get back to talking about the football.


